Some Projects Completing in 2011

Sanangwe Pr. School, Masvingo, Zimbabwe

Sanangwe school currently enrolls over 400 students from K-Grade 7. Up until now its only building is an old house which is totally inadequate and has many hazards for students including missing stairs and broken windows.



The community has come together to support the school by volunteering labour and making the building blocks. The new classrooms are due to be in use by late September 2011.

Eagle's Nest Phase 3 Polokwane, S. Africa

Eagle's Nest Christian School has grown to over 500 students. With funds donated by Fort Saskatchewan Christian School in Alberta, through C4A, they are building a block of classrooms which will help house their senior students. The school has a strong outreach program and partners with Canadian schools to reach out to Christian Schools in Zimbabwe and Zambia.



Aunt Elvi Mikkola Christian School, Rukungiri, Uganda

The classroom building project at Rukungiri started in



March 2011 and is due for completion in November 2011 when representatives from C4A will attend the official opening. The school offers Christian education for primary students up to grade 7.

Gateway Christian School, Pietermaritzburg, S. Africa

In April 2011 Gateway Christian School which caters for disadvantaged primary-aged children in the area, was granted funds to build much needed classrooms for their senior students who were



being housed in a dilapidated asbestos portable building. The new rooms will be ready for the next school year, January 2012.

Living Faith Early Learning Centre, Mmbatho, S Africa



In February 2011 a group of teachers from Western Canada ACSI schools were on site when the first of the construction materials arrived at Living Faith Christian School for the building of the Early Learning Centre. The facility is due for completion by December 2011.

Tirrim Primary School Phase 2, Karr, Kenya

Tirrim Primary School provides Christian education for the young children of the nomadic Rendille people. A grant from C4A in 2009 allowed for the construction of a multipurpose building (see below) which could house 4-6



classes. Over 1000 students showed up the first day the new facility was opened in January of 2010. Thanks to funds from C4A donors a classroom wing is being constructed for the start of the next school year.

Classrooms for Africa (C4A) is a realistic, positive approach to the ongoing social and economic problems that plague sub-Saharan Africa. A significant difference can be made in the lives of individuals, and communities by focusing on the education of future generations.

C4A provides assistance to those who have taken on the challenge of providing Christian education to children. Across the continent churches and communities are starting Christian schools as a way of preparing children for the future. The vast majority of these groups do not have the resources needed to build schools so students learn under the trees, in overcrowded shacks or partly renovated containers. Worse still many students are denied

admission because of this over-crowding. Our goal is to build classrooms for these children who are the future of Africa.

The entire C4A initiative is donor driven. Donations are the only source of funds for building projects. The initiative is highly efficient with 95% of donations received for classrooms construction goes directly to projects. C4A partners with individual donors, Christian schools, churches and ACSI Western Canada.

Currently C4A is involved in Eastern and Southern African where a well established network of partners is in place to monitor projects and providing teacher training.

C4A is a ministry of the Dunamis Education Society (DES), a Canadian registered charity (#831879754RR0001). DES issues Canadian tax receipts for donations received.

Established in 2007 DES is committed to facilitating dynamic change in individuals and communities through education and interaction. The word "Dunamis" is the Greek root of words such as dynamite and dynamic and means super or divine power. "The Power of ONE to Make a Difference"

Some Projects Waiting for Funds

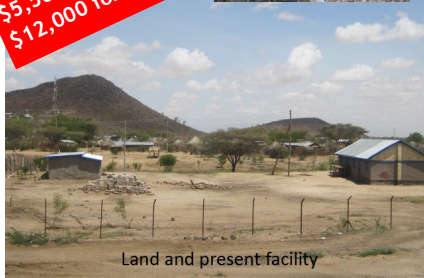
New Hope Centre, Lodwar, Kenya

The project is located in the village of Soweto, Lodwar, in Turkana land, north-west Kenya. The centre rescues street children in the town and seeks to address their spiritual, physical and educational needs.

\$12,000 for classrooms

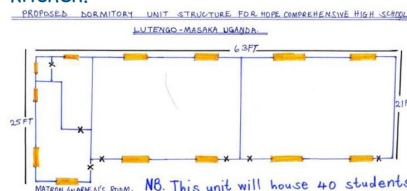


Land and present facility

The school will eventually provide Christian education from pre-school through Grade 12. Currently there are 24 students living at the centre and receiving an education.

Hope Secondary School, Masaka, Uganda—Student Facilities

In February 2011 the Hope High school opened its doors to their first students, mostly graduates of the Hope Primary school. One classroom is temporarily acting as the girls dormitory facility. Because of lack of funds they have made temporary tin washing and kitchen facilities (see below). The school is in desperate need of funds to build a girl's and a boy's dormitory block with proper bathroom facilities and also permanent kitchen.



Needed: \$15,000
per dormitory

Eagle's Wings Christian School, Lukaya, Uganda

The Eagles Wings Children's Village society wishes to provide high school education for students graduating from the primary school so they can continue to be educated from a Christian worldview. Land is available to build the high school near the primary building and plans have been drawn up for a new building.



Application was made to Classrooms for Africa for a grant to help fund the construction of the first phase of the high school - 6 classrooms
